We are still awaiting the Government's promised feedback on our interim plan for local government reorganisation, submitted in March, but in the meantime we continue to work with the other district and borough councils to progress proposals for either two or three unitary councils to meet the differing needs of our county's diverse communities.

An important part of this process will be seeking the views of our town and parish councils, and the residents, businesses, organisations and communities across our districts.

PROGRESS POWER COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

Administered by Mid Suffolk District Council's Community Grants Team

The Progress Power Community Benefit Fund is a three-year funding package secured as part of the development of the Progress Power Station (gas-fired power station) on the former Eye Airfield site.



Who can apply?

Grants can be applied by community groups or projects within the following parishes:

- Eve
- Yaxley
- Mellis
- Brome & Oakley
- Thrandeston

Funding is available for community groups towards a wide range of community projects and activity, including environmental and wildlife projects, community regeneration and improving access to facilities and services for children and young people.

Application Process

There are three application windows per year, each open for eight weeks and closing at the end of February, June and October:

- Window 1 opens 1 May and closes 30 June
- Window 2 opens 1 September and closes 31 October
- Window 3 opens 1 January and closes 28 February

Applicants are able to apply for a grant of between £250 - £10,000 for projects which demonstrate a wide community benefit and are fully inclusive. Two-year funding (up to a maximum of £20,000) is also available for those projects which can demonstrate a need for continued funding.

During 2025/26 the Grant Panel are particularly keen to attract applications from projects and activities that support Children and Young People.
