	The NDP scope is limited to planning policy for determining	
	applications for new development. The NDP role and that	
	of the NDP Group is not to provide solutions to existing	
	water management and sewage problems but to consider	
	the need for policies controlling new development to	
	ensure the problems do not get made worse by new	
	development.	
	The NDP could require all new planning applications to	
	show how surface water and sewage will be managed and
